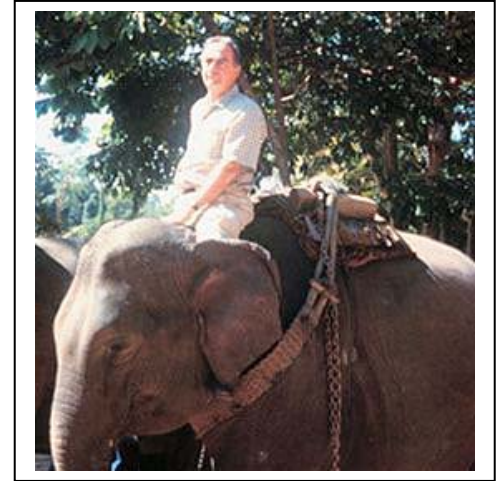

Major endeavors:

I entered the University of Arizona Department of Anthropology as a graduate student in Fall 1965. I served at the UA Grasshopper archaeology field school from 1966 through 1969, the last two years as Assistant Director. This foundation in Arizona archaeology enabled me to transition to Hawai`i and Southeast Asia. I joined the faculty of the University of Hawai`i at Manoa in Fall 1969 and have remained at UH for thirty six years, reaching the ranks of Professor, Associate Dean of Social Sciences, and Professor Emeritus (2005).

After an initial period of research in Hawaiian archaeology in the early 1970s, I began my first major research endeavor. Ethnoarchaeology and archaeology among the Agta hunter-gatherers of the Philippines dominated my interests and activities from 1972 through the mid-1980s, working with National Science Foundation funds. I continue to write and to research the Agta today, but on a reduced scale. In 1992, while Director of the Center for Southeast Asian Studies, I guided several faculty and graduate students in research in Maluku, Indonesia, as part of my Henry Luce Foundation grant of \$140,000. In 1994 former UH President Albert Simone appointed me "point man" for the University, working with the East-West Center on its "Indochina Students Initiative." With my East-West Center counterpart, I built an exchange program with the Royal University of Fine Arts in Phnom Penh, Cambodia. We brought RUFA students for special training to UH, and took a research and training program to Cambodia. I continue to direct the overall research and training program with RUFA,

working directly with the Minister of Culture and Fine Arts. As Chair of the Department of Anthropology from 1-1996 to 6-2001, I prioritized rebuilding the Department after faculty losses, maintaining its national standing, and enhancing the quality of its teaching and research. On 8-01 I became Acting then Interim Associate Dean of the College of Social Sciences. I am now Professor Emeritus of Anthropology. I was co-principal investigator on the “East Cambodia Archaeological Survey” from 2003 through 2004. I am now developing a study concerning contemporary “use and abuse” of the elephant populations of mainland Southeast Asia. I also am returning to research among the Agta of the Philippines.
