UH Dept. of Anthropology Phone Usage Policy for Remote Committee Meetings

- 1. Students whose committees include an external committee member participating via telephone teleconference have the responsibility to handle the logistics of communication, in consultation with their committee chair and Academic Support Office.
- 2. Expenses for a long distance call will be borne by the department, so long as the following conditions are met:
- a) SkypeTM or a similar free internet communications service will be used if at all possible. It is the student's responsibility to inform his/her committee member of this expectation and assist that person with installing needed software if needed. [SkypeTM is already installed on the iMac in our seminar room (ethno lab), Saunders 329, and provides clear audio and video connection with anyone who has a connection; see Academic Support Office for instructions]. The student is responsible for testing the connection with the external member prior to the committee meeting, checking the quality of audio and, if desired, video.
- b) If the student can demonstrate that it is impossible to utilize a free internet service (for example, the committee member cannot get access to a fast internet connection), then a scheduled call should be arranged. Committee Chair to ensure that time billed is well utilized; Academic Support Office will provide advice regarding phone access.
- 3. It will be the student's responsibility to arrange for a proxy in the event that the phone and/or internet connection is inoperable.

What is SkypeTM?

Free calls.
